For its **250<sup>th</sup> concert**, Kingston Choral Society will perform **Handel's Messiah**, as it did at its inaugural concert on precisely the same date, March 30, in 1950. The work needs no introduction; it has been a firm favourite ever since its triumphant première in 1742. An exciting quartet of young soloists joins the choir and the period instruments of the **Purcell Orchestra** to perform this wonderful sequence of beautiful arias and memorable choruses, climaxing with the unforgettable 'Hallelujah Chorus'.

Now in its 69th season, **Kingston Choral Society** has developed a reputation for performing concerts of a high standard, with recent performances including Bach's *St John Passion* and *B Minor Mass*, Haydn's *Creation* and Verdi's *Requiem* at Cadogan Hall, Mozart's *Requiem*, Mendelssohn's *Elijah*, Poulenc's *Gloria*, Monteverdi's *Vespers of 1610*, Howells' *Hymnus Paradisi*, Handel's *Solomon* and the world première of Graham Ross's *And since to look at things in bloom*.
